


# **Tuesday Night Tips**

## The Sydney Bridge Centre mini lesson

The Tuesday Night at City has developed its own vibe – a group of bridge enthusiasts playing a friendly competitive game with Phil Halloran and Martin Clear as the hosts. Phil organises the session to make sure there is no sit-out, and Martin continues to lead the group for bridge discussion after the session. He will pick an interesting hand from the face-to-face session for the Tuesday Tips column.

## A Little Light Card-Reading

F2F at City – Tuesday Night 28<sup>th</sup> June 2022



Board 1 of the 28-June Tuesday night face-to-face game at the Sydney Bridge Centre saw an excellent example of how card-reading helps in Pairs play. South opened 1♥, a bid I approve of because it has the quick defensive tricks that some light openings lack, and which may cause partner dismay if the auction ends in no-trump or defence. West bid 1N, the Pairs bid - have stopper, bid no-trump. There was no further bidding, and North, having no good suit of his own, had no trouble finding the lead of the 9 of hearts.

South wanted to make sure his Ace fell on an honour, so he ducked; and declarer won the King. Declarer crossed to the **A**K and led **A**2. South

wanted to show count, but it's a small mistake here: playing the \*10 on the first round prematurely untangled the suit for declarer. North won \*K, and led his other heart, and South was able to confidently play \*A knowing the \*J would drop under it. He then led \*10 to knock out \*Q, the final stopper in the suit (West and North each shed a diamond). Clearly to all at the table, South had set up two heart winners ready to cash.

Declarer now cashed the other three clubs (first the 9, then the Ace, then the Queen, discarding the heart from dummy), and South threw his two small diamonds. Declarer then tabled A and (at trick 10) led a spade toward the Queen-Ten combination, with the option of finessing the Ten or going up with the Queen. Let's look at the consequences of getting this right or wrong.

Declarer has 7 tricks already in the bag (2 spades 2 hearts, and 3 clubs), and he has lost 2: a club and a heart. Once he loses the lead he will not regain it, as the opponents must be able to cash red winners for the remainder of the tricks. So if he chooses to rise with AQ to ensure scoring it, he makes nine tricks if it drops the AJ, and eight if it does not. If instead he finesses AT, he makes 9 tricks if the finesse works, but only SEVEN if it fails. So there is a slightly greater potential loss for taking the finesse. Is there enough evidence for the finesse to outweigh this? There is indeed.

Is it as simple as "South had most of the hearts, so probably North has most of the spades", which works on the given lie of the cards? No, there's a much more certain result from counting. South has shown 5 hearts, 2 clubs, 2 spades and 2 (discarded) diamonds, but do his other two cards include the Spade Jack? Well, would YOU choose to make an opening bid with Jxx-AT8xx-Axx-Tx ... a fairly flat-shaped 9-count? To open the bidding, South's two unknown cards MUST have been the Ace and King of diamonds.

Declarer finessed and made 9 tricks, scoring 11 of the 12 matchpoints.
