All too often in club bridge games, I see declarer give away information to the defenders that the defenders should not be allowed to get. The most common situation is winning with too low a card. If you are declarer and a small card is led from your right through your AK holding, you should play the Ace. Sure, it is meaningless to you which of the honours you play, but if you play the King and it wins, the defender who led the suit will instantly know you still have the Ace ... because his partner would have obviously played that card on your King if it were possible to do so. Armed with the knowledge that you have another stopper in that suit, the defender may choose a different place to attack next time; one in which you are more vulnerable.

An illustrative example occurred on Board 10 of the 08-November Tuesday night face-to-face game at the Sydney Bridge Centre. North-South bid to a precarious 4♠ contract by South, and the opening lead was a small trump (not best). Declarer attempted to make something of the hearts and wanted to cross to dummy in clubs to do so. This was again not a good plan, but the opponents are not all-seeing so when the club was led, West ducked, and the club was won in dummy. The ♥A was led, discarding a diamond, and the ♥Q followed, discarding another diamond, hoping that East held the ♥K. None of this was a good line, but when West won with ♥K (winning a heart trick but with South ridding himself of his diamond loser, that was "swings and roundabouts"), West immediately led the AC and another club, giving East a ruff to set the contract.

Why did West find this line? Because when South initially crossed to dummy with a club, he led the \$6 and won with the SEVEN of clubs. When this card held, West knew his partner did not have the 8, the 9, the 10 or the Queen of clubs! So the club lead and ruff was 100% sure to work. The \$7 play gave West a huge chunk of information.

In practice, as I have mentioned in previous columns, it is advisable to 'interlace' a suit when you have a lot of touching cards. Declarer should lead the 8 and play the King, as this leaves the two clubs in the short hand (the Jack and Seven) interlaced between the cards held in the South hand (the Queen, Ten, Nine and Six). That means that later, declarer will be able to play to access the North hand or the South hand as many times as needed (with the defenders of course having their Ace to take at some stage), allowing maximum flexibility.
